

## Welcome Winter Visitors!

Telcome! You've come at a perfect time! While your friends back home are experiencing single digits, you're planning to spend your day outside in the mild temperatures; under clear skies and lots of sunshine. You traded snow boots and earmuffs for sandals and sunglasses.

You won't be disappointed. There is much to see and explore in this area along the Colorado River Lower Basin. The natural beauty alone will have you pausing to pull out your camera.

Let this Visitor Guide, and maybe a GPS, lead you on a winter adventure in the southwest. Lake Havasu City is home of the London Bridge, tempting lake for fishing, plenty of desert terrain for off-roading and hiking, and a short ferry ride across the lake to Havasu Landing Resort Hotel and Casino in Calif. Lake Havasu City also offers a calendar packed with crowddrawing events, including Havasu Balloon Festival and Fair, Winterfest Street Fair, Delbert Days Rodeo, Rockabilly Reunion, and Lake Havasu Bluegrass on the Beach Music Festival. And that's an abbreviated list of enticing events.

Highway 95 south to Parker will take you passed turnoffs for Cattail Cove State Park, Buckskin Mountain State Park, and The Desert Bar (aka Nellie E. Saloon). Parker, which not only offers parks for overnight camping along the edge of the Colorado River, but has a vast desert for off-roading, Bill Williams National Wildlife Refuge for hiking and bird watching, and the BlueWater Resort & Casino for entertainment and gaming excitement.

Point your RV toward Yuma or Quartzsite and you're bound to see familiar faces from

your last winter. Quartzsite, referred to as "The Rock Capital of the World," with its International Rock, Gem and Mineral Show, is a magnet for winter visitors with its relaxed environment. It is RV-friendly, as visitors have the freedom to park in the open desert.

The historic Southwestern community of Yuma offers a friendly Main Street and variety of Mexican and other restaurants. It has an array of RV parks that cater to winter visitors with activities and get-togethers. Yuma is also close to Los Algodones, Mexico, which offers shopping and less expensive dental and medical care and prescriptions than in the States.

In the other direction, the Tri-State area - which includes Laughlin, Nev., Bullhead City, Kingman, and Oatman, and Needles, Calif., - is a diverse group of towns. There's Laughlin with its stretch of casinos and access to Colorado River recreation, but also Oatman, an old mining town that transports visitors back to the Old West with its gun fight re-enactments.

Kingman, dubbed the 'Heart of Route 66' offers a history rich in everything Route 66. Stop-by the Powerhouse Visitor Center on your way to take drive on the Mother Road.

The towns might differ in what they offer and the visitors they attract, but the allure of the Colorado River, weather, and climate binds them together and makes for memorable winter adventure and stay. ❖

## Havasu Offers Outdoor Activities and a Full Calendar of Events

There are a number of reasons why Lake Havasu City is a popular winter destination - especially for those who want to be active and enjoy the outdoors. The weather is ideal this time of year and complements the area's natural amenities - a well-stocked lake for fishing, and desert and mountain trails for hiking, biking and off-roading.

Lake Havasu City also offers a busy Calendar of Events with weekly choices that include fairs and festivals, variety of concerts, rodeos, stockcar racing, swap more.

"Winter visitors enjoy our sunshine, natural environmental beauty, community size and, of course, the robust event schedule. We often hear that they are thrilled that there are multiple events held every weekend, so there is always something for everyone to do, along with having a small community that still offers all of the

necessary amenities," said Jackie Leatherman, Director of Experiences for Go Lake Havasu, the City's visitor bureau.


The number of events that Havasu hosts from January to April is a big draw for winter visitors - many of whom volunteer their time to assist with events. The Annual Havasu Balloon Festival & Fair, January 18-21, for example, is "100% volunteer run and requires a crew of over 1,200 people to work different jobs and shifts over the 4-day event, not including several days of setup and teardown," said Balloon Fest Executive Dimeets and farmers markets, and much rector Steve Ticknor. Winter visitors are a big part of that.

> "Lake Havasu City's winter visitors are often at our events, volunteering or enjoying our local restaurants and bars; we see them being very active, including boating, kayaking, fishing, hiking, and off-roading," said Leatherman.

Fair, some of the crowd-drawing events until April include: Buses by the Bridge (Jan. 11-14) Delbert Days Rodeo (Jan. 27-28), 38th Annual Winterfest Street Festival (Feb. 3-4), 35th Annual Western Winter Blast Pyrotechnics Show (Feb. 15-18), Lake Havasu Rockabilly Reunion (Feb. 16-18), Havasu Art Trail (Feb. 24-25), 21st Annual Bluegrass on the Beach Music Festival (March 1-3), 9th Annual Deuce Show presented by Havasu Deuces (March 7-9), 3rd Annual Southwest Chowderfest (March 9), Lake Havasu Stampede Rodeo (March 15-17) and London Bridge Renaissance Faire (April 5-7).

For music lovers, two series return. The 2024 Tribute Concert Series presented by TAD Management is back at the LHC Aquatic Center with 25 shows; and the Lake Havasu Concert Association presents the final five shows of its 2023-24 Concert Season at the Lake Havasu High School Performing Arts Center.

For auto racing enthusiasts, Havasu 95 Speedway runs a November through April schedule with full-size cars running on the quarter-mile asphalt track, and karts running on the infield's dirt track. The track's wildly popular Night of Destruction that features the Waterless Boat Race is scheduled for April 27.

## **Craig Hamilton Shares Australian Cowboy Stories**

Craig Hamilton was raised on a ranch in Arizona, learning the cattle business from a young age. He grewup around cattle, horses, and the rodeo; and followed his father's footsteps and became a cowboy. He competed in the National Finals Rodeo (NFR) and even went pro twice, once at only 16-years-old. Craig, the founder/owner of Great American Beef Company, resides in Kingman with his wife, Maria, and their sons, Chase, Boone, and Gunner, and their border collie named Bam Bam.


With his knowledge of the rodeo industry, Craig started to travel and taught other cowboys. He even went to Australia multiple times back in 2001 for a total of about four to five months.

The ranches in Australia are called stations, and the cowboys are known as ringers or stockmen. Craig said that stations would reach out and hire him to teach roping clinics and horseman clinics. The stories he shares about his time at each station in Australia makes you feel like you were there with him.

On one of his trips, he was met by a couple of barefoot cowboys named Q'ey and Mondzi-Monzhey. He said they were feral, but good-hearted men. While there, they would start at daybreak gathering cattle and at about 10 o'clock in the morning, the rain was lightly coming down. Craig and a group of about seven cowboys came into the trees. They jumped off their horses and hobbled them to restrict their movement so they were free to roam, but could not run off.

While the horses grazed, rehydrated, and bed down to rest, the cowboys split-up to look for their favorite wood. After gathering their favorite wood, the cowboys would all pick a tree to sit under and build their own personal fires to set their billycan (stainless tea kettle) on. They did this so they could flavor their black tea by the smoke of the wood; some would add a little sugar with cane in theirs. The ringers would then sit and roll cigarettes with



loose tobacco culture. They called this a "Smoko" and took this break religiously every day around 10 in the morning to ensure the horses and themselves did not get overworked. They were able to take a 45-minute recharge session to sip tea, eat bikkies (biscuits) and smoke cigarettes while they rested their bodies.

Craig painted the picture as smoke raising-up out of a misty haze and light rain coming down through the gum trees, a barefoot ringer in his slickers (oil skins like a raincoat) leaned-up against a tree as he sipped tea and smoked a cigarette. Craig said it was timeless, something cowboys have been doing forever and will keep doing long after we are gone, it is an old and logical tradition.

These cowboys became like family to Craig because they were in some honest and vulnerable situations together in such a short time. He said they were known to test your mettle as an outsider to find your weakness, but they respect honesty too. He said if you didn't know what you were doing, you didn't lie, you just told them the truth.

When Craig left the station, he wasn't sure if he had been truly accepted by this group of cowboys. But then Mondzi went to his saddle and unbuckled his teapot that was protected in a leather case and gave it to Craig. This confirmed for him that he was, as this was a huge gesture. The value and significance of a cowboy's teapot was grand. Craig remembered a conversation about how Mondzi couldn't find his size Wrangler jeans in Australia Boone. Craig Hamilton photo.



Craig Hamilton passes his passion for riding to his middle son,

and if he did they were very expensive. So as soon as Craig landed back home, he went and bought 15 pairs of jeans and mailed them to Australia for Mondzi. He said they have not spoken since, but he sometimes imagines what those guys might be up to these days.

Craig told another story of how he and some cowboys were leading a herd of about 300 cattle out to sell and replace and they had to cross a river that was about 10-feet deep. Before he went out to lead the herd, the cowboys told him to watch out for the alligators. Craig asked them to be sure they were not messing with him, and they said, "No, there are really alligators in there." They added that the alligators would not mess with him until his third pass and then they would attack.

With that in mind, Craig headed out into the river by horseback with the alligator filled water up to his ribs. The entire herd did not follow him in the first couple of passes, so he had to go back across for more. Before his last pass, he started counting how many passes he had made by then and the cowboys assured him it was enough that the next one might be the one that sets the alligators off. They decided to find a different route, and about two miles up they found a bridge to cross instead.

Craig said that he led the 300 cattle across this 100-yard-long bridge made of wood, with no side rails and just one lane. When he looked back, the cows were crossing it three wide and the bridge was full with the

river about 150 feet from the top of bridge. Thankfully, they all made it safe and sound, but he had moments when he wondered if they would.

Australia and the cowboy culture. He said there are dirt roads so narrow you would be met by a bull wagon road train (picture a semi-truck pulling four to five trailers) and he would have to drive off the road to let them pass because they held their lane. He said Australia is also known for camp

The cowboys would also herd cattle on motorcycles, not just horses.

efore Jan Kassies and his wife, Cinda, moved to Lake Havasu City in 2003, he didn't realize it was home to the London Bridge.


Over the years, Jan, who was born and raised in the Netherlands, has become an expert on all things Lake Havasu City, including the transplanted bridge.

So much so, that in 2007 Jan became Director of Visitor Services for Go Lake Havasu. He now runs the Visitor Center, answers questions from travelers, and gives walking tours of the London Bridge.

Before moving to the States, Jan had a career in education from elementary school teaching to school principal. Then, in 2002 when he met his wife, Cinda, he moved to Ohio where they lived for a year. The couple decided they wanted to find their forever home, and after deciding what they wanted, set out along the Colorado River.

After visiting multiple towns and discussing their options, they realized that nowhere compared to Lake Havasu City.



they sent him back to the station to grab the truck, trailer, and horse. It started to rain, so they warned him about the road and the "black dirt," but he had no idea what they were talking about. That was, right up until he did. It had rained for a good two hours and he was riding along when all of a sudden, the ground looked dark and his bike slid out from under him. He said it was so slick he could not keep the bike up and had to push it through the dirt. He got to the station and had to go back on the same road and hoped it had cleared-up. Luckily, the truck pushed through the slime. Craig said it was the blackest and slickest substance he had ever experienced.

Craig also spent one trip at Taipan Bend where he and another cowboy were going pig hunting for dinner. The cowboy looked back at Craig and said, "Grab a stick and beat the grass mate." Craig was confused as to why, until the cowboy said, "There are taipan snakes all over here; that is how the bend got its name, mate."

The cowboy then added that they are one of the most poisonous snakes - they are big and if you get bit by one, you will not make it out alive. Craig said after 100 yards or so, he started to wonder if there were any snakes around when suddenly, one took off in front of him. He said it was so big it moved the grass as it slithered away and he could tell where it was going because it was like a plow. It was then that he truly started to beat the grass. Luckily, they got their pig, made it back through the bend, and ate it for dinner.

These were just a few of the amazing tales Craig told from his adventures with the Australian cowboys. His

enthusiasm and love for their way of life and culture made this writer feel like she was there, too. ❖





asked Jan to volunteer with him, Jan had only lived in Havasu for a year and did not feel adequate for the job. However, Wes assured him that with the knowledge he had and Jan's ability to speak English, Dutch, German, French and Saxon, Wes believed this was a perfect spot

Jan believes that a visitor center should be an inviting space where people want to spend time learning about the destination, but in a quick amount of time. Jan used his background in teaching and his view from a consumer's perspective to renovate and design the interior

props for guests, and multiple TV's throughout the building with short clips of what activities Havasu has to offer. Including, but not limited to, off-roading, fishing, hiking, the beach, golfing, boating, and shopping.

for Jan, and that is where Jan's career in tourism began. a glimpse into Jan's view of the town with his mixture of Lake Havasu City and London. ## Hiking Lake Havasu Area One Trail at a Time

tunities - from easy hikes for the novice, to more strenuous ones for the seasoned hiker.

Those new to hiking or to the area should start with a visit to the website, GoLakeHavasu.com, which provides a list of hiking trails that includes their difficulty level, GPS coordinates, and details about the trail. Another good way to start is to hire a guide, who can help visitors navigate the desert terrain and find the best trails to fit their ability and fitness levels.

"Winter visitors just like to get out and enjoy the (aka SARA's Crack). desert; they are usually happy with all of the hikes, depending on their experience and ability or if they want to be on the trail for one hour up to four hours, It's also a good way to stay active and in shape," said Jackie Leatherman, hiking expert and owner of Havasu Hikes the only commercial hiking guide company in Mohave County.

> "I've been hiking out there for 12 years and I am still finding trails and areas that I have never been," she said. "It is a very giving park. We also have hikes that suit all ranges of experience from easy to difficult, such as Table Top at SARA Park or Crossman's Peak."

> For the beginner or new to hiking SARA Park, Leatherman recommends her Wanderlust hike or Slot Canyon

> "I also recommend that new hikers stay to the right of the main trailhead at SARA Park, it is not too hard to get turned around in that part of the park," she said.

> SARA Park features three of the five on Leatherman's list top hikes. Table Top, Slot Canyon and Pilot Rock are popular for different reasons, she said.

"The Slot Canyon is by far the most popular hike; we "I wanted to offer the opportunity for locals and tour- have one of the only Slot Canyons to hike through in Arizona. It's a gorgeous fun hike," said Leatherman.

> "Table Top (or Lizard Peak) "has more of an ascension to the hike, but great views and people like to see the lizard made of rocks up close and sit at the picnic table on top of the mountain," according to Leatherman. Hikers also like to explore Pilot Rock because it

offers a view of the shoreline and lighthouse at the end of the hike.

Two other well-traveled trails are outside of SARA Park and are more arduous and geared to expert hikers.

"Crossman's Peak is very popular for more experienced hikers who like a strenuous climb," Leatherman said. "And, of course, Cupcake Mountain is a terrific, but a challenging hike that should be on all hikers' bucket lists."

#### **COMMON HIKING MISTAKES**

It doesn't matter the hiker's ability level, there are safety precautions that need to be taken before tackling the trails. Hikers should have "good sturdy shoes, sun protection, and at least 17 ounces of water per person per hour of planning to be out on the trails.'

"I always tell new hikers: you don't prepare for what you know will happen, you prepare for what you don't know will happen," Leatherman said.

"I often see people heading out into the desert with only one 12-oz bottle of water. That is not enough water, even for experienced desert hikers. They also expect to be able to find their way out of the desert, but if they aren't used to reading rocks and mountains, it is easy to get turned around."

Leatherman advises to "always pay attention to your continued on page 15



surroundings, wear bright colored clothing, layer your clothes and always tell someone where you are going and when you expect to be done with your hike. Food is also one of the best temperature regulators, so it is important to bring a snack.

"People may think: I don't plan to be hiking for that long so they won't bring a snack, sun protection or enough water, but then heaven forbid they get turned around, or twist an ankle and end up being on the trails longer than expected, that is when you are grateful for preparing properly."

## HIRING A GUIDE

Hiring a hiking guide can enhance you hiking experience by being able to relax and not worry about getting lost. Leatherman is certified in wilderness first aid and venomous snake training, so she is prepared to help in the event of an emergency.

A unique feature that Leatherman brings to her hikes is her knowledge of Lake Havasu City from weekday job as Director of Experiences for Go Lake Havasu, the City's

## Wildlife Refuges Offer Free Guided Walks

Both refuges will offer free guided nature walks from now until early spring. These ongoing events are free and open to the public. Remember to wear sturdy shoes, dress in layers, and take water.

The nature walks started pre-pandemic, but were postponed and reinstated during the 2022-23 season by Jessica Samuelson, Park Ranger, Bill Williams River NWR.

"Both of the walks we're offering this year are more generalized nature walks," Samuelson said. "We talk about birds we see, but also include things like other wildlife, plants, habitat types, and refuge management practices.

"Both refuges are managed for migratory birds. Bill Williams River is a great place to spot water birds such as grebes, diving ducks, and great as well as desert birds like roadrunners, quail, phainopepla, or loggerhead shrike. Havasu refuge attracts marsh birds like rails, dabbling ducks, and geese."

Bill Williams River has more established visitor facilities including a Visitor Center, hiking trails, fishing

docks, and a kayak launch tor Center is open Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The Havasu Refuge is more spread out, said Samuelson.

"It stretches from Mesquite Bays and Castle Rock Bay in Lake Havasu, up through the Gorge to Topock Marsh and Pintail Slough near Golden Shores," she said. "Depending on the location, visitors to the Havasu refuge may enjoy kayaking, fishing.

Both refuges are open from sunrise to sunset. Camping is not permitted. They are both free to visitors.

## **BILL WILLIAMS NWR**

The Bill Williams River National Wildlife Refuge offers a 1.5-mile guided walk each Thursday morning from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. from now until April 11. The walks begin at the Visitor Center



tourism bureau.

"I am able to help them with their entire experience in Havasu, answer their questions, direct them to things to do, places to go and events to visit, as well as chat about some of the history that they may not be aware of," said Leatherman. "We all know the story of the London Bridge, but there is more to the story of Havasu's history."

## **BEST ADVICE FOR HIKING HAVASU**

Winter is peak hiking season in Arizona, and Leatherman suggests that early-risers start at daybreak, but recommends planning on being out of the desert no later than 4 to 5 p.m. due to sun set.

And always, "stay present."

"Hiking is a great time to not think about the past or worry about the future, but rather really live in the moment, pay attention and enjoy your surroundings," Leatherman said. "Nature is really healing if you allow your mind to relax and take it all in."

It has been independent since 1995 and receives a portion of the hotel occupancy and restaurant/bar taxes levied by the City of Lake Havasu City for its funding. The agency is an accredited member by Destinations International, making it one among only a few hundred organiza-



tions worldwide with this designation.

Some of what Go Lake Havasu does is oversee the Visitor Information Center, publish an official visitors' guide, maintain an updated website that provides information regarding the community to visitors, assist with large group visits and conferences, and assist the more than 400 events that the city hosts each year.



If you're looking for something to do straight from the Wild West, put on your cowboy boots and head to Rio Mesa Ranch, which sits east of Parker. This winter marks its 13th Winter Series of Ranch Sorting and Mini-Penning, and touts being the home of the largest Round Robin in Arizona.

Rio Mesa Ranch began in 2010 and has been finding and featuring some of the best riders in Arizona, according to its website. From coaching riders on the ins-and-outs of the sport to honing their skills, owners Pauline and Roy Leivas are proud to teach not only the love of the game, but to also impart the ideals of good sportsmanship, teamwork and loyalty. They also offer clinics from some of the best clinicians in the sport for Beginners, Intermediate and Advanced riders to help them step up their game or just to learn the sport of Ranch Sorting and Team Penning.

Contestants travel from Texas, Montana, Canada, Las Vegas, Wyoming and California. This year, buckles will be awarded to winners in every class, in addition to the 50% payback in both the Open Class and the Amateur Novice Class.

Pauline and Roy met over 20 years ago in Parker where Roy grew-up. He spent 25 years with the Navy before returning to his hometown of Parker where he bought the ranch.

"He was born and raised just down the driveway, first house on the right," said Pauline. "I was an Army brat. I

was born in Germany where my dad was stationed, then we moved to California and I came to Parker in 1993."

Pauline fell in love with the horse business when her daughter took-up horses in 4-H, so it was a natural fit when she met Roy. Together, Pauline and Roy have built-up Rio Mesa Ranch and host weekend events four times every winter.

"We have five acres of dry camping and 80 horse stalls," said Pauline. "We give the youth, ages 16 and under, an opportunity to practice at the ranch. It's really cool to see the progress they make every year, along with the adult Amateur Novice riders!"

Over the years, there have been some improvements to the facilities, including a gateless entry.

"There's no need to have someone opening and closing the gate all the time," said Pauline. "That makes the process a lot smoother. We're able to run 50 teams an hour now!

"We are really beginner-friendly here. In addition to a chance to win one of the top three spots with the 50% payout, they also have a chance to earn a buckle as the First Place Winner."

The Sorting Event on Saturdays consists of two riders and 10 head of cattle, numbered 1-10. The announcer determines which number the riders start with and their task is to try to get as many cattle in numerical order into a pen in sixty seconds.

On Sundays, the event is 2-Man Mini-Penning where two riders must sort two specifically numbered cattle from a herd of 20 head and pen them at the other end of the arena in 60 seconds. The rider must pen their two head without any trash cows in the pen before time is called.

The Leivas have help in running the event from friends and sponsors. Several of the sponsors include BlueWa-

The Rock House Visitor Center is on the California side

"It starts at #40 to the north and extends down to the Salome/Windom area," said BLM Park Ranger Heather Casares. "The Rock House Visitor Center was pretty much dormant for a year until Maureen and Glen came."

"The summer brings a lot of boaters here, partly due to it's the only free boat ramp in the area. There is also boat cleaning equipment here to vacuum and clean out your boats.

"Since Maureen and Glen have been here there has been a significant increase in traffic and visitors."

Maureen has displays of maps of the area and a map of the old Swansea copper mine on the Arizona side of the Colorado River, which is northeast of Parker off the Shea Road about 25 miles.

"A lot of people come in wanting to know more about the history of this area," said Maureen. "They will ask, 'Why is it called Rock House?' and things like that."

Both Moore and Casares agreed, "We would like to have more information available on the history of this area. If anyone has old photographs or information on the communities and the copper mines that used to be here, we would love to have that included here at the Visitor Center."

Maureen also writes a weekly newsletter on the happenings at the Visitor Center, as well as cartoons. You can get on her list to receive these when visiting.

Rock House Visitor Center is open: Sunday, Monday,

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. It is closed Tuesday and Saturday and all major holidays.

From Parker: Drive north across the bridge over the Colorado River and turn right. The Visitor Center will be 14 miles ahead on your right.

From Lake Havasu City: Cross the river on the Parker Dam. The Visitor Center is a little more than eight miles south on the left side. ❖







### Having Off-Road Fun in Quartzsite

uartzsite is the confluence of major off-road trails, with thousands of miles of trails. Locally, the Bureau of Land Management La Posa Travel Management Trail system has thousands of miles of marked trails. The area is rife with historic resources,

There are four groups of mountains surrounding the core of Quartzsite. In these areas, there is a wealth off-road trails and sights including: old mine sites, active mines, stone cabins, petroglyphs, geoglyphs, grinding mortars, natural springs, wildlife, unique rock formations, and more. Most areas are accessible by dirt roads that are easily traversed with today's off-road vehicles. The Arizona Peace Trail, a 675-mile loop trail through Mohave, La Paz, and Yuma Counties. It is the Premier off-road adventure, with enthusiasts coming from all over the world to ride the trail.

"Quartzsite Off-Road," was founded by Mark Goldberg, under the Quartzsite Improvement Association – Quartzsite's oldest non-profit Association, to promote off-road fun and safety. A comprehensive Off-Road Atlas of the Quartzsite area was created and published in 2016; with a 2024 update. The Atlas covers 325 square miles in Quartzsite, and contains 33 topographic maps, information on 100 off-road points of interest in Quartzsite and nearby towns, GPS information, emergency checklist, relevant laws, off-road clubs and organizations, lodging, restaurants, and more.

The atlas is designed for use by the average person who may not have GPS equipment and technical skills; but it is also available on Avenza Maps for download to your cellphone or GPS device for full navigational capability. The atlas is available at locations in Quartzsite and



### **Quartzsite Camels:**

### The Legacy of the U.S. Army and Hadji Ali

By Mark Goldberg

romedary, Arabian camels, (one-hump) are seen on the Town Seal for Quartzsite; on Town entry signs; and at various locations part of the Arizona Centennial Project. The camels are the legacy of the United States Army.

In 1856, at the direction of Lieutenant Edward Beale, camels were for the first transcontinental camel train as an experiment to re-

place mule trains used as the supply method to the Pacific Coast. Phillip Tedro, aka Hadji Ali, a Syrian-born camel driver, was brought to the U.S. to manage the camels. He was locally known as "Hi Jolly," the American interpretation of his name. Camels could carry a thousand pounds of freight, sixty-five miles a day; and, could survive three days without water or food. The camel's odors, unusual habits, and generally foreign look were not well-received by competing mule packers, Army drivers, and the general public. There was only one recorded transcontinental camel

The impending Civil War and the development of the "iron horse," resulted in the cancellation of Beale's camel train budget. Some camels were sold, others were taken to Yuma where they were released into the desert. Hi Jolly purchased several of the camels. He became a U.S. Citizen in 1880, and ran a freight service between mining towns in eastern Arizona and the Colorado ing legacy of the 100th Anniversary of

The Ashes of Hi Jolly, and his favorite camel, are interred in a special monument erected in his honor by the Arizona Highway Department; dedicated by the Governor in 1935. The Hi Jolly Cemetery in downtown Quartzsite is one of the mostvisited National Historic Landmarks in Arizona. The plaque on the monument reads,

The last camp of Hi Jolly. Born somewhere in Syria about 1828. Died at Quartzsite, December 16, 1902. Came to this country February 10, 1856. Camel driver - packer, scout over 30 years a faithful aid to the U.S. Government. Arizona Highway Department 1935

### Visit Los Algodones, Mexico

re you planning to make a visit to Algodones, Baja California?
Here are some tips to make your • visit easier and more satisfying:

- If you only want to shop for souvenirs or purchase medication in Los Algodones, you may find it easier to park on the U.S. side of the border and walk across the border. Pharmacies, medical offices, curios shops, liquor stores and other businesses popular with tourists typically are located along the streets near the border.
- When shopping for items sold by street vendors, don't hesitate to negotiate prices. But be realistic in your counter offer.
- If a merchant won't give you the price you want, see if you can get a better deal from another vendor, who, chances are, will be offering the same or similar merchandise.
- The legal drinking age in Mexico is 18 years.
- Travelers who are not California residents, but who live in the U.S., can bring more than one 1-liter bottle every 30 days through the U.S. Port of Entry at Andrade, Calif., although they will be

charged duty. They must be at least 21 years of age.

- Do not bring a firearm or ammunition with you to Mexico. If caught, you will go to jail and your vehicle will be seized.
- When returning from visits to Mexico, U.S. citizens must present a U.S. Passport book, passport card, enhanced driver's license or Trusted Traveler Program card to officers at U.S. ports of entry.
- A U.S. passport book is used for travel by air, land or by sea. A passport card can be presented when returning to the United States through a land or sea port, but not at an airport.
- Canadian citizens returning from visits to Mexico can present a valid Canadian passport, enhanced driver's license or Trusted Traveler Program card.
- For Mexico travel advisories, visit the U.S. State Department website at https:// travel.state.gov/content/travel/en.html
- If you're planning to go south of the border with \$10,000 or more in currency or checks, you will need to declare it by completing a form FinCEN 105. Failure







Since July 2023, visitors have had another reason to spend time in the Visitor Center. Upstairs, located right outside the Route 66 Museum, is the "Guardian Angel of Route 66 Experience", which is an interactive exhibit that chronicles the life of Angel Delgadillo, who grew-up and still lives in Seligman. Angel founded the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona to help preserve the historic highway after Interstate 40 was built and bypassed the Mother Road and its communities. Since opening, this free exhibit has been very popular, especially with international travelers. (Read the story in this section to find about more about Angel and the exhibit.)

"We have had visitors from all over the world leave messages in the exhibit exclaiming how much they enjoyed it," said Nikki Terlesky, with the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona.

Outside the Visitor Center sits the "Route 66 Drive-Thru Shield". In 2021, the Kingman Office of Tourism and Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona commissioned the permanent sign, which

By February 2024, another sign is expected to become Kingman's newest landmark near the Drive-Thru Shield. The late Scott Dunton, of Kingman, gifted the city a vintage Las Vegas Boulevard Cupid's Wedding Chapel neon sign cabinet that will be renovated into a sign declaring "Kingman, Heart of Historic Route 66". The Visitor Center can point travelers to must-see museums and landmarks, including taking "A Walkabout Kingman with Jim Hinckley". Developed by Kingman Main Street in 2022, it is an interactive, self-guided, audio-narrated tour of significant sites around Kingman and Route 66.

Use your mobile device to scan the QR code on the plaque in front of the site to listen to Hinckley, an acclaimed author and historian, talk about each stop. Visit www.Kingman.tours to find the list of points of interest and tour map.

The tour starts at the Kingman Train Depot at 4th Street and Andy Devine Avenue where a statue of Hinckley stands. It was commissioned by Kingman Main Street and created by sculptor J. Anne Butler.

We hope the exhibit helps more visitors get the 'Angel Experience' where visitors leave touched and inspired by this unique experience highlighting a oneof-a-kind individual," Terlesky said.

In the back of the exhibit, there is a large screen with a virtual Angel where visitors

Angel was one of eight children born in Seligman in 1927 in the home his family built. He spent a great amount of time in his father's pool hall and barbershop as a child. In 1933, the family was forced to close their business. His brothers' musical talents were the only thing able to keep them in Seligman

during the Great Depression. Angel joined the band as a drummer when he was 12 and went on to play the saxophone when his brothers got drafted, to keep The Delgadillo Family Orchestra going. The family and its original band continued to play together for 80 years.

Angel left to attend barber school in 1947 in Pasadena, California, but returned to Seligman after graduating and finishing his apprenticeship in Williams, Arizona. In 1950, he was able to re-open the family's pool hall and barber shop. He met his wife, Vilma, in 1958, got married a year later, and they went on to have four children together.

In 1978, Seligman, was bypassed by the Interstate 40 and business started to plummet. After sending letters and fighting on

the towns behalf, in 1982 they finally added Seligman to the interstate signs. In 1987, Angel and other local business owners started the first association like it called "The Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona".

Angel is known for helping others, and his love for his town and his family is prevalent throughout his works. At 96 years young, Angel loves to share his story with others to inspire them to fight for what they believe in.

In November 2023, Angel received the 2023 President's Award of National Leadership in Historic Preservation in Washington D.C. Angel, Vilma and their children traveled to Washington D.C., thanks to the generosity of Krystal Burge, president of the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona.

In 2005, after months of research, the couple started Mohave County's only full-service alpaca ranch named 'Alpacas of the Southwest'. They currently house 28 alpacas, and although they have no employees, they have a pot belly pig that helps with clean-up and a few livestock dogs that guard the ranch and the alpacas.

Ron and Anna's first group of alpacas came from Oregon and one of them named Dezzy is still with them. They name all of their alpacas in relation to the members and songs from the 1960's band "The Beatles". Some of the names they chose are: Hershey, Teddy, Belle, Kosmo, and McCartney. McCartney was the first alpaca baby born on the ranch and still lives there today. All of their alpacas are DNAregistered and microchipped, so Ron and Anna can keep track of their family tree for breeding.

makes it hypo-allergenic and wearable by anyone. The alpacas' fiber stays dry, odorfree and clean during the summertime; and in the winter, it stays nice and warm. Each alpaca produces anywhere from five to ten pounds of fleece.

'Alpacas of the Southwest' is open to the public for tours, shopping, and learning about these gorgeous animals. The ranch hosts about 1,100 guided tours per year from locals, out of state visitors, and even international travelers. During the tour, visitors come to understand why Ron and Anna love alpacas so much.

The tour takes just over an hour to

like cashmere and is Lanolin-free, which complete. During the tour, visitors can feed, pet, and take selfies with the alpacas, and should be prepared to fall in love with these beautiful creatures. The Nyberg's have a large, enclosed barn and are able to give tours during inclement weather.

> This is a tour the whole family can enjoy. It's a great stop for people to include on their vacation from Las Vegas to the Grand Canyon, and back. The tour costs \$20 per vehicle, for up to five people. Buses are welcome, with prior arrangement.

> Don't pass-up checking-out the on-site store in-person or online - packages ship anywhere in the United States. The store offers multiple products made from the fibers from the ranch's own alpacas. Products include, but are not limited to: rugs, gloves, hats, sweaters, scarves, and the ranch's famous alpaca socks. These socks are the store's most popular item and come in 12 different types.

The ranch is open to visitors all season on Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday from 10:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.; but call ahead to confirm, as the schedule can change.

### New Landmark Celebrates 'Heart of Historic Route 66'

ingman is getting a neon sign that celebrates its motto as the 'Heart of Historic Route 66', thanks to a generous donation from a long-time local resident and business man.

According to Josh Noble, Kingman Tourism Services Manager, the vintage Las Vegas Boulevard Cupid's Wedding Chapel neon sign cabinet came into the possession of the late Scott

whose last name is behind the 'D' in Mr. D'z Route 66 Diner. The Kingman businessman, who passed away in March 2023, was an advocate for Route 66 and Downtown Kingman.

"Mr. Dunton donated it to the City of Kingman before he passed in order to be renovated into Kingman's newest landmark. The new sign will sport neon lettering with marquee lights that will read 'Kingman, Heart of Historic Route 66', a motto Kingman has boasted for three decades (since 1993)," Noble said.

The project was awarded to Legacy Signs & Iron of Kingman. Sign restoration got underway and the infrastructure and sign footer were installed in November 2023.

The sign will be located 200 feet west of the famous Route 66 Drive Thru Shield (120 W. Andy Devine Ave.), directly across Route 66 from Dunton Motors Dream Machines in Downtown Kingman.

A special Valentine's-themed dedication event and inaugural lighting

ceremony is being planned for around Valentine's Day 2024.

The Dunton family still owns Mr. D'z,105 E. Andy Devine Ave., but it's been operated by another couple for many years.

The family also owns Dunton Motors in Bullhead City and Dream Machines in Kingman.



The name, "Hive Five Meadery" comes from the Young's having three children and being a family of five in the honey hive.

If you are unfamiliar with Mead, to put it simply, Mead is an alcoholic honey wine. Shawndy shared that it is the same process and concept as grape wine, but instead of fermented grape juice, they use fermented, watered down honey. They create many staple flavors including Black Cherry Vanilla, Mango, and Vanilla, but have amazing seasonal flavors as well.

Hive Five Meadery opened in November of 2022 in its current location at 6927 E Brooks Blvd. in Kingman, out in Valle Vista. There, you can enjoy Mead on tap in the tasting room, purchase bottles to take home, as well as leave with some H5M merchandise. Hive Five Mead can also be purchased in Kingman at Kwik Stop, The Cellar Door Beer Wine Bar, Cella Winery, and in Lake Havasu City at SummeRay Wine Bar.

Shawndy and Matt see the need for their product to be closer to their consumer and said they are looking for a change of pace. They plan to move their business to one of the oldest building basements downtown, speakeasy style.
